Introduction of The Organization

LABOUR EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT SOCEITY

The year 2007 was a momentous year for labour education and development society, a nongovernmental organization to safeguard the life of construction and sewerage workers. The activities carried out by the organization are highly recognized by people because of its significance. People, especially Dalits, from different parts of the India are working in Delhi, Usttrakhand and Rajasthan as construction workers and sewerage workers risking their life only for livelihood. There is a tendency for the society to categorize people according to their works. People who are engaged in works like manual scavenging, construction of building etc are labelled as low class people. It is considered as a caste based occupation for Dalits and so this is the most extreme manifestation of caste discrimination based on work and descent.

Labour education and development society helps to workers in the unorganized sector for organizing them into a structured team which enables them to stand for their rights. As a part, it is supporting Dalit construction and sewerage workers in many ways like providing legal aids, assisting government for implementation of acts protecting Dalit workers, giving awareness on their development, educating them as well as facilitating education for their children etc. It also emphasis on migrant children education abolishment of child labour education women's development scheme , health programmes, awareness campaigns etc. in construction workers' colony and at work sites.

1.2 DAY CARE CENTER (DEV NAGAR)

LEDS running homeless shelter from last three years at Dev Nagar slum area .In slum area from last 15-20 years people residence here .Approximately there is 2500 jhuggies . And

total population of slum area is 4000.there is mostly migrant workers from UP.MP and Bihar. Mostly man doing a work of riksha pooling and construction site. Women doing housekeeping job and mad servant job .and their monthly income is 4500-5000.so they can't provide best education and better life to children's .Just because LEDS started a Daycare center as a shelter for homeless children and their better future.

Under the activity, the organization has been running drop-in-center with support of Chandra Charitable Trust at the identified at Dev Nagar Karol Bagh New Delhi. With daily average attendance of 35-40 children in which about 25-30 children permanently reside in center 10-15 whilst children movement. The purpose behind



its establishment was to support the targeted children with all basic needs and their rehabilitation as per their current circumstances. The center is successfully including the following activities for the development of targeted children:

Fasitivals

This practice built rapport building between community and teachers and parents send their children to schools. Parent meetings are organized every week in school campus, in which teacher discussed problems, activities, progress etc of students with parents. Students present their cultural activities in front of community by singing group carol, traditional folk songs, and music at least one day in the week. These practices create feeling of culture among the students.

During the year, students organized Baal Sabha in which they sing, dance, competition etc, which helped them to develop personality as culture values. Exposure visit by students have been organized on a quarterly basis in which they visited to government offices, forest and make familiarized them with activities of post office, big schools, police station, bank etc. Students celebrate national festivals like Independence Day, Republic day and Gandhi Jayanti.\

World TB (Tuberculosis) Day Celebration

On 24th March of 2013 on the occasion of TB day a program on TB awareness was organized by the Delhi Government in Purva Sanskriti Kendra (PSK)Laxmi Nagar . As TB has emerged as one of the most critical issues in today's perspective therefore the Society under its regular activities organized rally and conference on the issue.

On this occasion, organization people delivered lectures on different aspects of TB with the participation of school and college students and Doctors and different district hospital staff members and community members using banners and leaflets displaying the issue based information.

In this process, the information on TBs were imparted to youths and college students of the area and tried to resolve their myths and



confusions on it by organizing question session also. The topics of lecture were; the current situation of TB, symptoms of TBs, causes and precautions. and students and volunteers play nukkar natak related to TB awareness programme

HEALTH MELA

Health camp

This was the most accessible of the events as the clinic is right off the paved road from. The clinic was decked out with posters, banners, and ribbons to celebrate the beginning of the Health Mela. Effective pre-mela publicity, including volunteers of the organization going to surrounding community and distribution of flyers drew many people from the surround community, including: With a total population of around 300.

We estimated 250-300 community people participated during the Health camp.

The health camp was specially organized for children women and construction workers in Dev Nagar and Sarai rohila slum area,

Objective

The main aim of organized health camp was providing basic health facility to poor people and awareness about health problems because for lower income they can't access better health facility just because they suffered from health disease/problem.

Medical Observations:

- Nutritional dietary assessment (24 hour recall of foods eaten)
- Clinical assessment for micro and macro nutrient deficiency doctor

SHGs Promotion Programme:

This year, in 08 dev nager three SHG group of the organization has focused on formation of women SHGs. The objective behind the group formation was to make the poorer community self-sustainable with thrift and credit activities. Under this process, the organization has formed 03 SHGs by organizing community meeting and trainings of beneficiaries on SHG concept and income generation through it. With the formation of 04 SHGs this year, total 45 women of BPL section involved in thrift & credit activities.also run the last two year community rasoi though SHG group.
